ContaX LLC is committed to protecting the privacy of its users. This privacy notice for ContaX LLC ("we," "us," or "our"), describes how and why we might collect, store, use, and/or share ("process") your information when you use our services ("Services"), such as when you:

- Download and use our mobile application (ContaX), or any other application of ours that links to this privacy notice
- Engage with us in other related ways, including any sales, marketing, or events

We use Your Personal data to provide and improve the Service. By using the Service, You agree to the collection and use of information in accordance with this Privacy Policy. If You do not agree to this Privacy Policy, please do not access and use the Application. This statement and the policies outlined here are not intended to and do not create any contractual or other legal rights in or on behalf of any party.

1 Interpretation and Definitions

1.1 Interpretation

The words of which the initial letter is capitalized have meanings defined under the following conditions. The following definitions shall have the same meaning regardless of whether they appear in singular or in plural.

1.2 Definitions

For the purposes of this Privacy Policy:

- Account means a unique account created for You to access Our Service or parts of Our Service.
- Affiliate means an entity that controls, is controlled by or is under common control with a party, where "control" means ownership of 50% or more of the shares, equity interest or other securities entitled to vote for election of directors or other managing authority.
- Application means the software program provided by ContaX LLC downloaded by You on any electronic device, or any other application of ours that links to this privacy notice.
- Business refers to the Company as the legal entity that collects Users' personal
 information and determines the purposes and means of the processing of Users'
 personal information, or on behalf of which such information is collected and
 that alone, or jointly with others, determines the purposes and means of the
 processing of Users' personal information.

- CCPA refers to the California Consumer Privacy Act.
- Company (referred to as either "the Company", "We", "Us" or "Our" in this Agreement) refers to ContaX LLC, 300 North Greene Street, Suite 1900, Greensboro, NC 27401.
- Country refers to United States.
- **Device** means any device that can access the Service such as a computer, a cellphone or a digital tablet.
- **Do Not Track (DNT)** is a concept that has been promoted by US regulatory authorities, in particular the U.S. Federal Trade Commission (FTC), for the Internet industry to develop and implement a mechanism for allowing internet users to control the tracking of their online activities across websites.
- Metadata means data providing information about one or more aspects of the data; additionally, metadata includes data that You choose to provide with Your User Content, e.g. any labels used to mark shared data.
- Personal Data is any information that relates to an identified or identifiable individual, relating to You such as a name, an identification number, online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity. Furthermore, Personal Data means any information that identifies, relates to, describes or is capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with You.
- **Service** refers to the Application.
- Service Provider means any natural or legal person who processes the data on behalf of the Company. It refers to third-party companies or individuals employed by the Company to facilitate the Service, to provide the Service on behalf of the Company, to perform services related to the Service or to assist the Company in analyzing how the Service is used.
- Third-party Social Media Service refers to any website or any social network website through which a User can log in or create an account to use the Service.
- **Usage Data** refers to data collected automatically, either generated by the use of the Service or from the Service infrastructure itself (for example, the duration of a page visit), including, but not limited to, User-Generated Content.
- **User-Generated Content** refers to web links, emails, phone numbers, media that you choose to create with or upload to the App.
- User means a natural person accessing or using the Service.
- You means the individual accessing or using the Service, or the company, or other legal entity on behalf of which such individual is accessing or using the Service, as applicable.

2 Collection and Using Your Personal Data

2.1 Personal Data

We collect personal information that you voluntarily provide to us when you register on the Services, express an interest in obtaining information about us or our products and Services, when you participate in activities on the Services, or otherwise when you contact us. The personal information that we collect depends on the context of your interactions with us and the Services, the choices you make, and the products and features you use.

While registering and using Our Service, We may ask You to provide Us with certain personally identifiable information that can be used to contact or identify You. Personally, identifiable information may include, but is not limited to:

- Email address
- First name and last name
- Phone number
- Usage Data
- Your phone and social network contacts, with your permission. If You choose to
 find other users through Your phone contacts, We will access and collect the
 names and phone numbers and match that information against existing users of
 the Platform. If You choose to find other users through Your social network
 contacts, We will collect Your public profile information as well as names and
 profiles of Your social network contacts.
- Information to verify an account such as proof of identity or age
- Information in communication You send us.

2.2 Contact Import

Contact import is an optional feature that allows us to check which of your contacts in your device's address book are also ContaX users. It also means we can update your ContaX contact list when your contacts who aren't using ContaX yet sign up later. We care about your privacy and we don't share your contact list with other companies.

When you use contact import and grant ContaX access to your device address book, ContaX will access and upload the phone numbers in your address book typically daily, but this depends on various factors including how often a user uses ContaX, including those of ContaX users and your other contacts. We don't collect any of the other information that could appear in your device address book including email addresses, groups etc.

2.3 Usage Data

Usage Data is collected automatically when using the Service.

Usage Data may include information such as Your Device's Internet Protocol address (e.g. IP address), browser type, browser version, the pages of our Service that You visit, the time and date of Your visit, the time spent on those pages, unique device identifiers and other diagnostic data.

When You access the Service by or through a mobile device, We may collect certain information automatically, including, but not limited to, the type of mobile device You use, Your mobile device unique ID, the IP address of Your mobile device, Your mobile operating system, the type of mobile Internet browser You use, unique device identifiers, model of your device, the device system, network type, device IDs, your screen resolution and operating system, app and file names and types, keystroke patterns or rhythms, battery state, audio settings and connected audio devices and other diagnostic data.

Where you log-in from multiple devices, we will be able to use your profile information to identify Your activity across devices. We may provide you with the option to register with us using your existing social media account details, like your Facebook, Twitter, Google, Apple or other social media account. If You decide to register through or otherwise grant Us access to a Third-Party Social Media Service, We may collect Personal data that is already associated with Your Third-Party Social Media Service's account, such as Your name, Your email address, Your activities or Your contact list associated with that account.

You may also have the option of sharing additional information with the Company through Your Third-Party Social Media Service's account. If You choose to provide such information and Personal Data, during registration or otherwise, You are giving the Company permission to use, share, and store it in a manner consistent with this Privacy Policy and such information may be publicly displayed by the Third-Party Social Media Services. We expressly disclaim any and all liability for the actions of Third-Party Social Media Services as well as any other third parties, including but without limitation to actions relating to the use and/or disclosure of information by any Third-Party Social Media Services as well as any other third parties. Any information submitted by You directly to these Third-Party Social Media Services as well as any other third parties is subject to that third party's privacy policy.

2.4 Information Collected while Using the Application

While using Our Application, in order to provide features of Our Application, We may collect information. Where required by law, We will seek any required permissions from You prior to any such collection.

- Information regarding your location, including location information based on Your IP address and/or SIM card.
- Information from your Device's phone book (contacts list)
- Pictures, images and other information from your Device's camera and photo library

We use this information to provide features of Our Service, to improve and customize Our Service. The information may be uploaded to the Company's servers and/or a Service Provider's server or it may be simply stored on Your device. If you wish to opt out from sharing this information with us, you may turn them off in your device's settings at any time.

2.5 Use of Your Personal Data

The Company may use Personal Data for the following purposes:

- **To provide and maintain Our Service**, including to monitor the usage of Our Service and improve and develop Our Service.
- To facilitate Account management: to manage Your registration as a User of the Service. The Personal Data You provide can give You access to different functionalities of the Service that are available to You as a registered User.
- **To contact You:** To contact You by email, telephone calls, SMS, or other equivalent forms of electronic communication, such as a mobile application's push notifications regarding updates or informative communications related to the functionalities, products or contracted services, including the security updates, when necessary or reasonable for their implementation.
- To provide You with news, special offers and general information about other goods, services and events which we offer that are similar to those that you have already purchased or enquired about unless You have opted not to receive such information.
- To manage Your requests and prove identity: To attend and manage Your requests to Us and prove Your identity in order to use certain features such as verified accounts.
- To deliver targeted advertising to You: We may use Your information to develop and display content and advertising (and work with third-party vendors who do so) tailored to Your interests and/or location and to measure its effectiveness.
- For business transfers: We may use Your information to evaluate or conduct a merger, divestiture, restructuring, reorganization, dissolution, or other sale or transfer of some or all of Our assets, whether as a going concern or as part of bankruptcy, liquidation, or similar proceeding, in which Personal Data held by Us about Our Service Users is among the assets transferred.
- For other purposes: We may use Your information for other purposes, such as
 data analysis, usage, reports, effectiveness, identifying usage trends,
 determining the effectiveness of Our promotional campaigns and marketing and
 to evaluate and improve Our Service, products, services, marketing and your
 experience.

2.6 When and with whom do we share your personal information?

We may share Your personal information in the following situations:

• With Service Providers: We may share Your personal information with Service Providers to monitor and analyze the use of Our Service, to show advertisements to You to help support and maintain Our Service, to advertise on third party

websites to You after You visited Our Service, for payment processing, to contact You.

- For business transfers: We may share or transfer Your personal information in connection with, or during negotiations of, any merger, sale of Company assets, financing, or acquisition of all or a portion of Our business to another company.
- With other Users: when You share personal information or otherwise interact in
 the public areas with other Users, such information may be viewed by all Users
 and may be publicly distributed outside. If You interact with other Users or
 register through a Third-Party Social Media Service, Your contacts on the ThirdParty Social Media Service may see Your name, profile, pictures and description
 of Your activity. Similarly, other Users will be able to view descriptions of Your
 activity, communicate with You and view Your profile. We may collect
 information about You from other publicly available sources.
- With Your consent: We may disclose Your personal information for any other purpose with Your consent.

2.7 Retention of Your Personal Data

The Company will retain Your Personal Data only for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out in this Privacy Policy. We will retain and use Your Personal Data to the extent necessary to comply with Our legal obligations (for example, if we are required to retain your data to comply with applicable laws), resolve disputes, and enforce Our legal agreements and policies.

The Company will also retain Usage Data for internal analysis purposes. Usage Data is generally retained for a shorter period of time, except when this data is used to strengthen the security or to improve the functionality of Our Service, or We are legally obligated to retain this data for longer time periods. When we have no ongoing legitimate business need to process your personal information, we will either delete or anonymize such information, or, if this is not possible (for example, because your personal information has been stored in

backup archives), then we will securely store your personal information and isolate it from any further processing until deletion is possible.

2.8 User Generated Content

We or others may store, display, reproduce, publish, or otherwise use User-Generated Content, and may or may not attribute it to You. Others may also have access to User-Generated Content and may have the ability to share it with third parties. It means that this information may be transferred to — and maintained on — computers located outside of Your state, province, country or other governmental jurisdiction where the data protection laws may differ than those from Your jurisdiction.

Your consent to this Privacy Policy followed by Your submission of such information represents Your agreement to that transfer.

The Company will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that Your data is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Policy and no transfer of Your Personal Data will take place to an organization or a country unless there are adequate controls in place including the security of Your data and other personal information.

2.10 Disclosure of Your Personal Data

2.10.1 Business Transactions

If the Company is involved in a merger, acquisition or asset sale, Your Personal Data may be transferred. We will provide notice before Your Personal Data is transferred and becomes subject to a different Privacy Policy.

2.10.2 Law enforcement

Under certain circumstances, the Company may be required to disclose Your Personal Data if required to do so by law or in response to valid requests by public authorities (e.g., a court or a government agency).

The Company may disclose Your Personal Data in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to:

- Protect the personal safety of Users of the Service or the public
- Protect against legal liability

2.11 Security of Your Personal Data

4 CCPA Privacy

This privacy notice section for California residents supplements the information contained in Our Privacy Policy and it applies solely to all visitors, Users, and others who reside in the State of California.

4.1 Categories of Personal Information Collected

We collect information that identifies, relates to, describes, references, is capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked, directly or indirectly, with a particular User or Device. The following is a list of categories of personal information which we may collect or may have been collected from California residents within the last twelve (12) months.

Please note that the categories and examples provided in the list below are those defined in the CCPA. This does not mean that all examples of that category of personal information were in fact collected by Us, but reflects Our good faith belief to the best of Our knowledge that some of that information from the applicable category may be and may have been collected. For example, certain categories of personal information would only be collected if You provided such personal information directly to Us.

Category A: Identifiers.

- o Collected: Yes

 - Examples: Education records directly related to a student maintained by an educational institution or party acting on its behalf, such as grades, transcripts, class lists, student schedules, student identification codes, student financial information, or student disciplinary records.
- Category K: Inferences drawn from other personal information.

Under CCPA, personal information does not include:

4.2 Sources of Personal Information

We obtain the categories of personal information listed above from the following categories of sources:

- Indirectly from You. For example, from observing Your activity on Our Service.
- **Automatically from You**. For example, through cookies We or Our Service Providers set on Your Device as You navigate through Our Service.
- From Service Providers. For example, third-party vendors to monitor and analyze the use of Our Service, third-party vendors to provide advertising on Our Service, third-party vendors to deliver targeted advertising to You, third-party

disclosed, but reflects Our good faith belief to the best of Our knowledge that some of that information from the applicable category may be and may have been disclosed.

When We disclose personal information for a business purpose or a commercial purpose, We enter a contract that describes the purpose and requires the recipient to both keep that personal information confidential and not use it for any purpose except performing the contract.

4.5 Sale of Personal Information

As defined in the CCPA, "sell" and "sale" mean selling, renting, releasing, disclosing, disseminating, making available, transferring, or otherwise communicating orally, in writing, or by electronic or other means, a User's personal information by the business to a third party for valuable consideration. This means that We may have received some kind of benefit in return for sharing personal information, but not necessarily a monetary benefit.

Please note that the categories listed below are those defined in the CCPA. 4.6 Share of Personal Information

We may share Your personal information identified in the above categories with the following categories of third parties:

- Service Providers
- Payment processors
- Our Affiliates
- Our business partners
- Third party vendors to whom You or Your agents authorize Us to disclose Your personal information in connection with products or services We provide to You

4.7 Sale of Personal Information of Minors Under 16 Years of Age

We do not knowingly collect personal information from minors under the age of 16 through Our Service, although certain third-party websites that we link to may do so. These third-party websites have their own terms of use and privacy policies and we encourage parents and legal guardians to monitor their children's Internet usage and

instruct their children to never provide information on other websites without their permission.

We do not sell the personal information of Users We actually know are less than 16 years of age, unless We receive affirmative authorization (the "right to opt-in") from either the User who is between 13 and 16 years of age, or the parent or guardian of a User less than 13 years of age. 4.8 Your Rights under the CCPA

CCPA provides California residents with specific rights regarding their personal information. If You are a resident of California, You have the following rights:

- The right to notice. You have the right to be notified which categories of Personal Data are being collected and the purposes for which the Personal Data is being used.
- The right to request. Under CCPA, You have the right to request that We disclose information to You about Our collection, use, sale, disclosure for business purposes and share of personal information. Once We receive and confirm Your request, We will disclose to You:
 - o The categories of personal information We collected about You

 - Our business or commercial purpose for collecting or selling that personal information
 - The categories of third parties with whom We share that personal information
 - o The specific pieces of personal information We collected about You
 - o If we sold Your personal information or disclosed Your personal information for a business purpose, We will disclose to You:
 - The categories of personal information categories sold
 - The categories of personal information categories disclosed
- The right to say no to the sale of Personal Data (opt-out). You have the right to direct Us to not sell Your personal information. To submit an opt-out request please contact Us.
- The right to delete Personal Data. You have the right to request the deletion of Your Personal Data, subject to certain exceptions. Once We receive and confirm Your request, We will delete (and direct Our Service Providers to delete) Your personal information from Our records, unless an exception applies. We may deny Your deletion request if retaining the information is necessary for Us or Our Service Providers to do any of the following:
 - Complete the transaction for which We collected the personal information, provide a good or service that You requested, take actions

- reasonably anticipated within the context of Our ongoing business relationship with You, or otherwise perform Our contract with You.
- Detect security incidents, protect against malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal activity, or prosecute those responsible for such activities.
- Debug products to identify and repair errors that impair existing intended functionality.
- Exercise free speech, ensure the right of another User to exercise their free speech rights, or exercise another right provided for by law.
- Comply with the California Electronic Communications Privacy Act (Cal. Penal Code § 1546 et. seq.).
- Engage in public or peer-reviewed scientific, historical, or statistical research in the public interest that adheres to all other applicable ethics and privacy laws, when the information's deletion may likely render impossible or seriously impair the research's achievement, if You previously provided informed consent.
- Enable solely internal uses that are reasonably aligned with User expectations based on Your relationship with Us.
- Comply with a legal obligation.
- Make other internal and lawful uses of that information that are compatible with the context in which You provided it.
- The right not to be discriminated against. You have the right not to be discriminated against for exercising any of Your User rights, including by any of the following:
 - o Denying goods or services to You
 - Charging different prices or rates for goods or services, including the use of discounts or other benefits or imposing penalties
 - o Providing a different level or quality of goods or services to You
 - Suggesting that You will receive a different price or rate for goods or services or a different level or quality of goods or services

4.9 Exercising Your CCPA Data Protection Rights

Only You, or a person registered with the California Secretary of State that You authorize to act on Your behalf, may make a verifiable request related to Your personal information.

Your request to Us must:

- Provide sufficient information that allows Us to reasonably verify You are the person about whom We collected personal information or an authorized representative
- Describe Your request with sufficient detail that allows Us to properly understand, evaluate, and respond to it

We cannot respond to Your request or provide You with the required information if We cannot:

We will disclose and deliver the required information free of charge within 45 days of receiving Your verifiable request. The time period to provide the required information may be extended once by an additional 45 days when reasonably necessary and with prior notice.

Any disclosures We provide will only cover the 12-month period preceding the verifiable request's receipt.

For data portability requests, We will select a format to provide Your personal information that is readily useable and should allow You to transmit the information from one entity to another entity without hindrance.

4.10Do Not Sell My Personal Information

You have the right to opt-out of the sale of Your personal information. Once We receive and confirm a verifiable User request from You, we will stop selling Your personal information. To exercise Your right to opt-out, please contact Us at support@contaxapp.io.
